In this surreal world, percussionists play a unique array of homemade instruments, specifically created for the performance from actual plastic waste.

## A voyage through the Plastic Age: Soundtrack of the Plastic Age is a trip full of rousing percussion compositions and soundscapes.

Soundtrack of the Plastic Age is an audiovisual reflection of the time we live in today, the plastic age. Geologists also call this the 'Plasticeen', a geological period in which we find plastic as a 'raw material' in the soil.

The Rogier De Nijs Group invites you to join them on a voyage to environmental hot spots where the major effects of our consumer society can best be seen. The use of video projections creates a 3D image on stage that pulls the audience even closer in for a great effect, submerged in his rousing percussion compositions and original soundscapes.

#### **The Music**

The instrumental compositions are narrative and capture the imagination. The titles reflect the expression of the compositions: 'Lost in Excess', 'Plastic Eruption', 'Quest for Perspective', 'Solemn Walk'. Each one represents different perspectives of the Plasticeen Era. The music has been described as energetic and compelling but also fragile and refined.

## ROGIER DE NIJS

With Soundtrack of the Plastic Age, drummer Rogier De Nijs opposes our throw-away society and focuses on plastic waste in particular. He marvels at the ease with which single-use plastic is manufactured, sold and then ends up in our landfills and oceans. De Nijs considers it his job as an artist to do something about this. His goal is to prove that you can make extraordinary contemporary music with something that seems to have lost its value - plastic waste.

"I use music to bring attention to this issue and that feels to me like the most powerful tool I can use."



#### **Biography**

Rogier De Nijs (1979) is a drummer, composer and producer. With his music and his projects he wants to inspire people and get them moving on current social issues. The diversity in his portfolio represents diverse musical genres through which he feels particularly influenced. (From world music to punk music to Brian Eno to improvisation) His adventurous nature and versatility has taken him to numerous venues; from South America to the northern most tip of Europe.

Since 2015, De Nijs has been making music productions around the theme of plastic pollution. Previously, his EP "Musique Plastique." was released. The album "Soundtrack of the Plastic Age" will be released in the spring of 2023.
